Iowa Food Bank Association Receives Funding for Increased Refrigeration and Freezer Capacity

DES MOINES, IA – Additional refrigeration and freezer capacity opportunities will be available to Iowa food banks and pantries thanks to an Iowa Department of Natural Resources Solid Waste Alternatives Program grant.

The lowa Food Bank Association (IFBA) has been awarded \$40,800 from the lowa DNR which will be matched by \$10,800 from the eight food banks serving lowa. Iowa food pantries and community meal sites will be able to apply to receive up to \$1,000 towards storage equipment.

"We are thrilled to have this opportunity to boost the capacity in the state," says Cory Berkenes, State Director of the IFBA. "With this generous opportunity provided by the Iowa DNR, we should be able to fund the purchase and installation of nearly 55 new freezers and coolers for Iowa feeding organizations."

This grant follows a grant received at the end of 2014 that allowed the IFBA to provide refrigeration and freezer capacity to 27 feeding organizations throughout Iowa. "In 2015, the 27 awarded agencies experienced a 45% increase in perishable products distributed to struggling families," continues Berkenes.

Food pantries and community meal sites who are partners of one of the eight lowa Feeding America food banks will be able to apply for the funding through Friday, March 11. Recipients will then be chosen based on need by a committee made up of members of the IFBA and the lowa Waste Reduction Center at the University of Northern Iowa. The recipients will receive funds to off-set the expenses of purchasing additional freezers or refrigerators.
